Visit ART’S HOME for your creative “mud, clay, Plasticine and paint” experience. Working with Shadbolt arts instructors, and volunteers you can paint a Plasticine picture of your favourite “critter from Deer Lake”, sculpt that critter from clay and leave it to inhabit the magical Clay-a-thon environment. Try your hand at working on the potter’s wheel and explore the ancient technique of Chinese Brush painting . All ages welcome!

Sedna’s Igloo

Sedna's World showcase is a giant inflatable igloo which allows families to enter inside and discover a world of fabric art, zippers, embroidery, buttons and applique to find the secret of Sedna, the undersea goddess of the Inuit people. A children's costumed dance parade of arctic birds, fishes, butterflies, bears and penguins will be led by dancer Angela Brown.

In 1979, Vancouver artist Evelyn Roth created a participatory spectacle at the Burnaby Art Gallery. Indoor gallery installations, combined with eight outdoor events showcased her crochet webs for children, recycled videotape installations and inflatables.....

30 years later, Evelyn Roth returns to Burnaby where the theme of global warming and concerns about the polar ice melt are expressed through Sedna's in her igloo home.
